

Becky Chace has been chosen Best Female Vocalist





Friday - 13 - Songwriter Sessions





Jeffrey Foucault grew up in a small town in WI. His father played a plywood guitar and his mother liked to sing. Winter Sundays were for church or ice fishing, which are not so different when you think about it. He went to college, dropped out, worked on a fruit

farm and started writing songs. He finished school, roofed houses, drove a snowplow, and homeschooled the son of the local bar owner in exchange for beer. He cut his first album in the winter of 2000. Longtime disciple of the rich and strange music that sings behind the American veil, Jeffrey Foucault has spent the last decade mining the darker seams of country and blues, producing a string of spare and elemental albums of rare power while garnering accolades across the US and overseas for a tersely elegant brand of songwriting set apart by its haunting imagery and weather-beaten cool. Foucault's music is the kind so many aspire to but never attain: beat-up troubadour folk whittled to dolorous perfection.

Saturday - 19 - Joel Cage



Joel Cage is an award winning veteran singer and songwriter from Boston. A one-time member of the internationally acclaimed rock & roll group Southside Johnny & the Asbury Jukes, Joel has been performing regionally and nationally as a soloist for the past 15

years. He has performed at some of the most prestigious folk & acoustic venues & festivals in the country, including the Kerrville Folk Festival in TX where he was awarded top prize in the Kerrville New Folk Competition, and at the renown Club Passim in Cambridge, where he was invited to perform at their special 40th Anniversary Concert. Joel is a top prize winner in the John Lennon Songwriting Contest and is a three time winner of the USA Folk Songwriter's Competition. A virtuoso guitarist and an impassioned vocalist, Joel Cage's music is both evocative and raucous. He spans the gamut from sounding like a full rock band to hear-your-own-heartbeat intimacy.

Sunday - 20 - Ellis Paul

Ellis Paul is one of the leading voices in American



songwriting and one of the top songwriters to emerge out of the fertile Boston folk scene. He helped create a movement that revitalized the national acoustic circuit with an urban, literate, folk rock style that helped

renew interest in the genre in the 90's. His charismatic, personally authentic performance style has influenced a generation of artists away from the artifice of pop, and closer towards the realness of folk. Though he remains among the most pop-friendly of today's singer-songwriters, his songs regularly appear in hit movie and TV soundtracks, he has successfully bridged the gulf between the modern folk sound and the populist traditions of Woody Guthrie and Pete Seeger.

Saturday - 26 -**Gypsy Romantique with Daisy Castro**

Donna Dufresne is an eclectic singer, songwriter and performer northeast CT. Gypsy Romantique is the newest incarnation of Donna's adventures in song writing. Melding the gypsy inspired Paris hot club jazz of

the 1930's and American western swing of the same era, with their Latin influences and a touch of unabashed schmaltz.

Young violinist, **Daisy Castro**, started playing vio-

lin at the age of 6 and quickly learned to play by ear. She traveled to France with her parents where she was introduced to Gypsy Jazz. Intrigued as a listener from the start,

she has found this beautiful and passionate music to be a perfect fit for her playing style.

Over time she decided to control of her professional life. Today, by choice, she has no label and no manager for the first time in her career. In Lori's 6th album, Lorraine, she considers the influence of her mother, for whom she was named, as well as her own place in relationship to her husband, family and community.

Saturday - 23 - Yankee Dogs

The Yankee Dogs (Bill Reid, Louise Muller and Mike Barrette) came together during jam sessions at open mics and discovered a shared love of American roots music. Reid's interest in traditional

American music along with Muller's and Barrette's renown solo work makes for a fun and rollicking time through a catalog of western swing, folk rock, blues, rockabilly, rock & roll, and bluegrass.

Saturday - 30 - Sarah Blacker

Sarah Blacker is a full-time touring singer/songwriter, and part-time Board Certified Music-Therapist for children with special needs. A recent nominee for a New England Music Award for female performer of the year, and singer/songwriter of the year

by Limelight Magazine, she also took home the title of Artist of the Year from My Rural Radio based out of Central PA for 2011. 



Our Pricing Practices

- 1. Sales Tax Included Our prices include the 6% Connecticut Sales Tax. The prices listed on the menu are exactly what you pay. Our prices may seem to be inflated; however, a \$8.50 menu item is actually \$8.02 + \$.48 sales tax. Furthermore, this practice makes it easier for the customer, especially if that customer is a child who has exact change for a cookie. What you see is exactly what you pay what could be simpler?
- 2. Not Market Standard Pricing We are not trying to fool the customer into thinking that \$8.95 is less expensive than \$9.00. We find this type of pricing insulting to our customers. However, the reason it is used so extensively around the nation is that it works effectively. We don't like that practice, and we also like to believe that our clientele is not so easily fooled.
